Concept Note

In many research and policy-related disciplines, the empowerment of women remains highly salient. This is especially true in the upper echelons of the fields where think tanks dominate, such as security, foreign policy, economics, and energy. Underrepresentation persists despite the high levels of female enrollment in higher educational programs that feed into the research and administrative positions in think tanks.

Affording women equal opportunities to be thought leaders is a fundamental right that is independent of any economic benefits that this may confer. Despite this, scholarly research has demonstrated the existence of significant returns associated with ensuring that women have equal access to top positions in the research community. The simplest cause is that women represent half of the labor pool, and marginalizing them is tantamount to artificially limiting the depth of talent from which to select leaders. Beyond this, leadership teams that are more diverse in composition tend to be more diverse in terms of ideas generated, which is critical for research institutions.

Accordingly, the 6th Annual Derasat Forum will examine the causes of the existing imbalances by directly engaging current think tank leaders and the next generation who will be looking to take over the reins in the coming decade. The Forum will also explore the impacts of female empowerment by the Supreme Council for Women in Bahrain while exploring effective methods of realizing more equitable outcomes for the sector. The sessions aim to look at the empowerment and trust in female researchers by weighing the significance of their research cases and the extent to which positive outcomes have been consequently realized and addressed.

Since female empowerment is a challenge that exists in many sectors beyond the research and policy world, the Forum will provide generic analysis that applies broadly. However, it will also focus on the issues that are specific to think tanks and thought leadership. This topic is especially important at present due to the increasing number of major crises the world is currently facing. The positive contribution that think tanks can make to policy is at an all-time high, and understanding how to maximize this contribution in a just and equitable manner is an issue that demands the attention of the entire research community.

ويعد العمل على تحقيق تكافؤ الفرص أمام النساء ليبلغن مناصب قيادية في مراكز الفكر تحدياً مهماً بمعزلٍ عن أية عوائد اقتصاديةٍ، رغم أن الأبحاث العلمية أظهرت وجود فوائد مهمة مرتبطة بضمان حصول المرأة على فرصة تولي مناصب عُليا في مجتمع البحث العلمي، أبسط أسباب ذلك هو تمثيل المرأة لنصف القوص العاملة، علاوةً على أن فرق القيادة الأكثر تنوعاً في تركيبتها هي الأكثر تنوعاً في طرح الأفكار، وهو أمرٌ في غاية الأهمية لمعاهد الأبحاث.

في ضوء ما تقدم، سيبحث منتدى در اسات السنوي السادس أسباب الاختلال الموجود في التوازنات بالإشراك المباشر لقادة مراكز الفكر الحاليين ومرشحي خلافتهم في العقد المقبل من الجيل القادم. سوف يسعى المنتدى أيضاً إلى استكشاف آثار التمكين النسائي من قبل المجلس الأعلى للمرأة في البحرين مع مناقشة الأساليب المؤثرة لتحقيق نتائج أكثر إنصافاً لهذا القطاع. كما تهد ف الجلسات إلى النظر في تمكين الباحثات من خلال الموازنة بين أهمية حالات بحثهن ومدى تحقيق النتائج التثائج ال

ونظراً لكون نقص تمثيل المرأة تحدياً ماثلاً في قطاعات أخرى غير البحث العلمي ووضع السياسات، سيقدم المنتدى تحليلاً عاماً ينطبق على نطاق واسع، إلا أنه سـيركز أيضاً على مواضيع تتعلق بمراكز الفكر وقيادة الرأي. هذا الموضوع ذو أهميةٍ خاصة في الوقت الراهن نظراًلاز ديادعدد الأزمات الكبرى التي يواجهها العالم حالياً، لعِظَم إيجابية الإسهامات التي بمقدور مراكز الفكر تقد يمها لعملية وضع السياسات الآن أكثر من أي وقتٍ مضى، وبات لزاماً على مجتمع البحث العلمي بأكمله أن يولي الاهتمام الاشع المطلوب لتحقيق أقصى المنافع من هذه الإسهامات بأسلوب عادل ومنصف.

Mrs. Al Ansari held the position of Assistant Secretary General of the Supreme Council for Women, in the rank of Undersecretary, between 2001 and 2010. She is also the Head of Media Affairs at the office of Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka Bint Ibrahim Al-Khalifa, Wife of His Majesty the King of Bahrain since 2000. She is the chair of numerous notable committees such as, Chair of the Joint Committee between the (SCW) and the Legislative Authority to support mainstreaming Women's Needs in Development since 2010, and Chair of the Committee of Her Royal Highness Princess Sabeeka Bint Ibrahim Al Khalifa Award for Bahrain iWomen Empowerment also since 2010. She holds numerous national and international memberships such as member of the Board of Trustees of the Royal University Women Bahrain (2019-Current), and member of the Commission on the Status of Women (CSW) of the United Nations Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC) (2017 – 2021). Her attained academic qualifications include a Women's Leadership Development Program (Diploma) from Coxford University- Said Business School (2020) and a Master of Business Administration from Golden Gate University – United States of America (1994).
